Midwest Sailing Conference Saturday, May 14, 2016

8:00 am to 7:00 pm

Milwaukee Community Sailing Center - 2016 Keynote Speaker: Sally Barkow

Like many Midwest sailors, Sally Barkow started sailing in small boats on small lakes. "My roots are in lake sailing which is really good at preparing you for short courses and unpredictable wind. And it also teaches an incredible level of patience. I was not sure how these skills were going to transform into ocean racing but I was surprised to learn that sometimes patience and the ability to read unpredictable winds are really valuable skills to have on the ocean, in offshore racing."

Family support and competition kept the challenges rising locally, nationally, and internationally. Sally continued sailing and racing through her college years at Old Dominion University. In 2002 the Lady Monarchs won the ICSA Women's North American Collegiate Sailing National Championship. Leading from start to finish, Sally credited intensity and teamwork for their success. Next was match racing with championships in 2004 and 2005. Recognition came as US Sailing selected Barkow as the Rolex Yachtswoman of the year in 2005 and 2007. Sally competed in the Yngling keelboat in the 2008 Olympics but was disappointed in her bid to participate in 2012 in Womens' Match Racing.

Then Team SCA proposed an all-women's crew for the 2014-15 Volvo Ocean Race. How could she resist? "It was an opportunity of a lifetime which I couldn't miss out on, made possible by this team forming, and I just knew I had to be a part of it. Coming from an Olympic background, it was a big decision to shift gears into offshore racing, but it is such a new challenge for me and something I have wanted to do for a long time."

From Pine Lake to sailing around the globe, Sally has gone a distance most of us only dream about. In October of 2015, Team SCA finished their last event in Genoa, Italy. What's next? Whatever it is be sure it will be exciting, challenging, and great sailing. As the members of Team SCA look for new sailing opportunities, Sally has chosen to be our keynote speaker at the 2016 Midwest Women's Sailing Conference. Quick! Catch her

before she disappears over the horizon again!
